After 6 meetings last year, most have learned how to successfully navigate the numerous rotaries in the area (I'm still working on that success!). The ever-changing beautiful artwork on display in the Center, makes up for the extra one or two trips around the block to get to my final parking place.

For directions, we suggest you use your GPS, however, here are a few details you might find helpful.

From RT 117 go straight past the first rotary, turn right at the second rotary (Dunkin Donuts), and a short distance to the next rotary go 3/4 around onto Post Road. <u>Immediately watch for the first driveway on the left (before the Town Hall) for parking in the back.</u> There is also parking on the street if you passed the WCFA (Armory building).

Being a "Networking" group, we'd like to encourage more interaction between the members. What better time to do it, than during that drive to and from the meetings. It was a pleasure hearing Jennifer speak about her experience with owning two businesses. By the Yard Comics, sewing related comics and Sew Fun, quilt sewing patterns. The crowd laughed most when Jennifer shared her relatable stories about the struggles and joys of sewing. Her experiences and her friends have influenced all her comics. **"No one is more motivated than a quilter with a baby shower tomorrow"** was a huge hit. Her response, **"You literally had nine months to do this".** This spoke to all the sewers in the room who have at one point or another completed a project just in time of the due date.

It was exciting to hear about Sew Fun, where she has used her love for quilting to create patterns for pillows, tote bags, baby accessories, etc. She shared her experience working with pattern companies, printers and publishers to grow her business to the success it is at today. She started out printing her patterns at staples and shipping them out and now works with a printing company directly.

Cupro is a regenerated cellulose fabric made from linter, which is cotton waste. It is silkysmooth and drapes just like silk. Unlike silk, cupro ignites easily and leaves behind coppercontaining residue. We are greatful for Denise who taught us about a fun fabric and cannot wait to see what she makes out of it.





Donna Miller was the raffle winner of one of Pamela's Patterns. She put it to good use by creating the top she was wearing.

She also finished her quilt top, look how great it came out! She plans to rent a long arm to finish the quilt.





Diane Stacy sewed a tool cart caddy that goes around a five-gallon bucket. This is her favorite gardening accessory. The idea came from a tool bag from Sailrite. The most fun part was



making the pockets.

# Jackie du Plessis December 5, 2023

## Needlepoint

Jackie du Plessis was born and raised in South Africa. After graduating college with a teaching degree in the arts, she and her husband emigrated to the United States. While living in South Africa she learned many forms of needle art from creative woman surrounding her including her mother and grandmothers. Coming to the U.S. provided a whole new source of supplies and a huge opportunity for Jackie to fine tune her talents in designing and finishing.

In 2000, Jackie's finishing business - It's Fine-ally Finished - became a reality and in 2002, she started focusing on designing and teaching dimensional needle art projects. In 2020 Jackie

branched out into the world of mother of pearl designing and reproducing buttons and needlework tools. Jackie draws her inspiration from many places including her extensive library of antique books and needlework antiques. Her projects are functional three dimensional needle art objects that feature a variety of interesting stitches and finishing techniques. She has taught at many venues throughout the United States, England, France and Canada. She loves sharing her artistic and technical knowledge with fellow needle artists and finds teaching her designs tremendously fulfilling.

Description of presentation.

A presentation by Jackie showcasing her projects from concept to finished product. Discussing how a design is developed and how supplies are selected and sourced as well as how she teaches in-person and on-line workshops,

A brief talk about her mother of pearl buttons and reproduction tools.

## The Queen of King Richard's Faire

"Queen Elizabeth's Closet" started out as repurposing thrift clothing to create a 1940s wardrobe as the rebirth of swing when it was at peak in 1998. Then it transitioned to Civil War garments while participating in and teaching during full scale reenactments. Eventually she started designing and creating historical garments for various industries including Renaissance faire actors, theaters and anyone who wanted a special custom gown. I can be found in the Fall, performing in my 6th season at King Richard's Faire as Queen Anne III. I also have a booth there, where I sell, one-of-a-kind, handmade, renaissance accessories.

We can't wait to learn how to design extravagant archival inspired attire, utilizing contemporary sewing techniques for the stage.

Since then, Kathleen has been experimenting with new ideas and combining mediums looking to reopen Double Button Designs by the end of 2024. Kathleen will discuss her journey from the classroom to the runway to the business world. Discover how old threads become new and star opportunities turn into an inspiring business. Learn what future your threads hold.

# **Amanda Downing Carney** May 7, 2024

## Trinity Rep Costume Designer

Amanda Downing Carney is the Costume Director at Trinity Repertory Company in Providence. She has a BFA in Theatre Technology with a concentration in Costume Design from URI and has toured nationally and internationally backstage with Broadway musicals as a Wardrobe Supervisor. She has lived in RI her entire life and has had a career in the arts for over 20 years.

Amanda will discuss inside the costumer's mind. A costume designer is required to use MANY varied skills and I'd love to tell you about all the different disciplines and steps involved in a successful design process from Brain to Stage. Including: Script and Character analysis, Color Theory, Clothing History, Texture and Silhouette, Collaborative Input and Magic Tricks. Listen to me explain how the form and function of costumes onstage also need to help tell a story to the audience.
