"It's Fine-ally Finished"

It was a pleasure having Jackie du Plessis speak about her needlepoint business "It's Fineally Finished." Before Jackie's presentation, I was unaware of the differences between embroidery, cross stitch and needlepoint. Embroidery's typical end use is to adorn clothing, home décor and accessories. Cross stitch is often used to create decorative items such as samplers, framed pieces and greeting cards. Needlepoint is a form of canvas work that uses cotton or linen and a special needlepoint needle to create stitched designs. There are a variety of stitches used to create intricate patterns and designs to produce decorative items such as pillows, cushions and wall hangings.

I was pleasantly surprised to discover Jackie not only creates beautiful needlepoint samplers, she then finishes them to be functional three- dimensional products and teaches others how to do the same.

After 6 meetings last year, most have learned how to successfully navigate the numerous rotaries in the area (I'm still working on that success!). The ever-changing beautiful artwork on display in the Center, makes up for the extra one or two trips around the block to get to my final parking place.

For directions, we suggest you use your GPS, however, here are a few details you might find helpful.

From RT 117 go straight past the first rotary, turn right at the second rotary (Dunkin Donuts), and a short distance to the next rotary go 3/4 around onto Post Road. Immediately watch for the first driveway on the left (before the Town Hall) for parking in the back. There is also parking on the street if you passed the WCFA (Armory building).

Being a "Networking" group, we'd like to encourage more interaction between the members. What better time to do it, than during that drive to and from the meetings. If you know someone that lives in your area, consider driving together. Not only might it save a little on gas, but you get to talk "ALL THINGS SEWING!" WCFA, situated in the historic Kentish Guard Armory building, is located on Post Rd in the heart of Apponaug WCFA offers plenty of lighted parking, handicap elevator, front and side door entry, good natural lighting along with overhead track lighting on the high ceilings, comfortable chairs, raised speaker platform with a podium and microphone, a basement classroom and outdoor patio area.



3. December Recap – Jackie du Plessis, Needlepoint

It was a pleasure hearing Jackie speak about her needlepoint business "It's Fine-Ally Finished." Jackie's background had a heavy influence on what she does today. In South Africa there was limited access to fine goods and a small range of threads and material colors available. When she moved to the United States at 25, she was excited to see the large variety of colors and now had the ability to make the fine goods she could only window shop. She joined a community at a needlework store in Walpole, MA. After noticing Jackie's abilities, the community of women soon started asking Jackie to finish their work. The shop owner also noticed and this developed Jackie into offering her finishing business.

Her business grew from finishing Christmas stocking at 6 different needlework shops to working with designers directly. There was a need for designers to have their work finished and developed into patterns for their customers. Soon the idea to do this for herself was possible by working with Sampler Gathering, a needlework festival in Plymouth, MA. Every April they would put on a needlework market that had a focus on education. This exposure helped built her business. She was able to purchase fabric and materials at wholesale with Sampler Gathering's backing. It also opened doors into future teaching and has allowed her to traveled throughout the United States, England, France and Canada.

What I appreciated most about Jackie is her mission to make beautiful three-dimensional functional products. Below you can find some images of her needle boxes, pin keeps, spool boxes, thread holders, thread winders, pin discs and buttons made in mother of pearl and more.

She also builds her student's skillsets and as a result their confidence to stitch and finish a piece. Check out her website to see which kit she is currently offering to teach and check out her Facebook for photos of her previous kits.

The Queen of King Richard's **Faire**

"Queen Elizabeth's Closet" started out as repurposing thrift clothing to create a 1940s wardrobe as the rebirth of swing when it was at peak in 1998. Then it transitioned to Civil War garments while participating in and teaching during full scale reenactments. Eventually she started designing and creating historical garments for various industries including Renaissance faire actors, theaters and anyone who wanted a special custom gown. I can be found in the Fall, performing in my 6th season at King Richard's Faire as Queen Anne III. I also have a booth there, where I sell, one-of-a-kind, handmade, renaissance accessories.

We can't wait to learn how to design extravagant archival inspired attire, utilizing contemporary sewing techniques for the stage.

Amanda Downing Carney is the Costume Director at Trinity Repertory Company in Providence. She has a BFA in Theatre Technology with a concentration in Costume Design from URI and has toured nationally and internationally backstage with Broadway musicals as a Wardrobe Supervisor. She has lived in RI her entire life and has had a career in the arts for over 20 years.

Amanda will discuss inside the costumer's mind. A costume designer is required to use MANY varied skills and I'd love to tell you about all the different disciplines and steps involved in a successful design process from Brain to Stage. Including: Script and Character analysis, Color Theory, Clothing History, Texture and Silhouette, Collaborative Input and Magic Tricks. Listen to me explain how the form and function of costumes onstage also need to help tell a story to the audience.
